Why Choose Us?

UChicago Medicine AdventHealth residency program follows published accreditation standards of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP). Our PGY1 residency program provides a postgraduate level integrated professional, patient-centered training



experience which builds on the Doctor of Pharmacy education. Many preceptors are board certified or residency-trained pharmacists providing clinical services and mentorship. Our purpose is to provide a goal-directed experience based on core rotations required to develop a clinical expert. Each resident experience is individualized to meet their personal learning goals.

Our program develops residents into independent practitioners who possess in-depth therapeutic knowledge to be competitive in a variety of career pathways including board certification eligibility, PGY2 pharmacy residency training, clinical specialist roles, and leadership roles within pharmacy practice. Our PGY1 residency fosters well-rounded autonomous clinicians through patient-centered care skill development, medication reconciliation, pharmacy student preceptorship, didactic lectures, research, and clinical leadership.

Experience Gained

Residents will promote the safe and effective evidence-based use of medications, improve the long-term health of patients, and decrease readmissions. Learning opportunities provide direct patient care in a wide variety of decentralized specialties, including emergency medicine, infectious disease, medication safety, research, rounding with family medicine residents and both clinical and administrative leadership. Our variety of rotational and longitudinal experiences refines the residents' in-depth knowledge and skills in pharmacy practice.

Additional education is available by attending professional meetings such as ASHP Midyear and ICHP Annual Meeting. Residents participate in ILRPC, Illinois Pharmacy Resident Conference and will obtain BLS and ACLS certifications. Other opportunities include participation in multiple pharmacy services including antimicrobial, anticoagulation and diabetes stewardship, cardiac arrest team, patient education, pharmacokinetics, and interdisciplinary committee membership.
